Yellow-legged hornet, *Vespa velutina nigritorax*

An invasive hornet from Asia which poses a significant threat to honey bees and other pollinators. Often confused with native hornets, see below for life size comparison highlighting key features:

Vespa crabro ✓ Native to UK

Legs: Yellow at ends
Head: Black from above, orange face
Thorax: Black and velvety
Abdomen: Mainly black with one obvious yellow/orange band
Activity: Never active at night

Brown
Brown from above, yellow face
Black and brown
Mainly yellow with black bands, spots marks like 'dripping paint'
May be active at night
