

Yellow-legged hornet, Vespa velutina nigrithorax

An invasive hornet from Asia which poses a significant threat to honey bees and other pollinators. Often confused with native hornets, see below for life size comparison highlighting key features:

Legs: Yellow at ends

Head: Black from above, orange face

Thorax: Black and velvety

Mainly black with one obvious Abdomen:

yellow/orange band

Never active at night Activity:

Brown

Brown from above, yellow face

Black and brown

Mainly yellow with black bands,

spots marks like 'dripping paint'

May be active at night
